

**RESOLUTION
R 264-09/10**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Selma, Alabama has the management and control of the finances of the City of Selma per State Law; and

WHEREAS, the Citizens of Selma approved a \$12,000,000 General Obligation Bond for the purpose of, including but not limited to, constructing improvements to the sanitary sewer facilities, streets and roads; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2010 the Selma City Council accepted the lowest responsible bid in the amount of \$82,680.00 from Frasier-Ousley Construction and Engineering, Inc. for improvements and repair on the O'Hara Place Storm Sewer Replacement; and

WHEREAS, Ray Hogg, Jr. with Hogg Engineering Corporation has confirmed and verified that the project is complete and has submitted an invoice to the City of Selma on behalf of Frasier-Ousley Construction and Engineering, Inc. recommending payment in the amount of \$80,613.00; and


WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Selma City Council to allow a portion of the General Obligation Bond in the amount of \$80,613.00 to be allocated from the Sanitary Sewer Improvement account (35.6200.514 430-4) for payment to Frasier-Ousley Construction and Engineering, Inc. for improvements and repair on the O'Hara Place Storm Sewer Replacement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SELMA, ALABAMA that the City of Selma hereby accepts the recommendation of Ray Hogg, Jr. with Hogg Engineering Corporation and hereby authorizes the Treasurer to make payment from the General Obligation Bond in the amount of \$80,613.00 to Frasier-Ousley Construction and Engineering, Inc. for improvements and repair on the O'Hara Place Storm Sewer Replacement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT said payment shall be allocated and taken from the Sanitary Sewer Improvement account (35.6200.514 430-4).


